HUSBAND - William Cannon Sr.

The following information may be for one William Cannon or more than one William Cannon. There was an association between a William Cannon and Simcock Cannon, as well as an association between Simcock's son Russell Cannon and William Cannon. A descendant of William Cannon matches closely in Y-DNA results with descendants of Russell Cannon and also Russell's brother, Richard Cannon.

1778 Washington Co., NC (TN). William Cannon, Poll Tax 100 (pounds), 1-06 Michael Woods, Esq. [born before 1757, most likely]

1781 Washington Co., NC (TN). William Cannon sued William Murphy for the return of a rifled gun. [no reference]

xx xxx 1782 Washington Co., (NC) TN. Robert Bayless conveyed a tract of land to William Cannon. This deed was not found. It may be part of a court oath.

The next two deeds are included to show that Simcock Cannon was present in Washington Co., TN, also, with Russell.

16 Mar 1783 Washington Co., NC (TN). James McAdams and Jemima his wife his grant of 10/24/1782 conveyed unto Peter Finch 200 acres of land on Cherokee Creek for 150 pounds NC money adjacent Ben Johnston, witnessed by R. Cannon. However, when court oath was made in the next term Simcock Cannon verified this sale. Pearson Brummet and Samuel Duncan were also witnesses.

16 Mar 1783 Washington Co., NC (TN). Deed between James McAdams and Samuel Duncan on the waters of Cherokee Creek adj. Abraham Anthony. Being part of a 400 acre tract granted to McAdams by grant 200 acres. Wit.: Simcock Cannon, Pearson Brummet, Foster Furing [Finney?]

20 Apr 1784 Washington Co., NC (TN). William Cannon conveyed to John Hunter, Jr., a tract of land containing about 50 acres on a branch of Cherokee Creek for 55 pounds. It being a part of a tract conveyed by Robert Bayless to Cannon in 1782. Wit.: Robert Rodgers, Thomas Rogers.

26 May 1784 Washington Co., TN: William Cannon conveyed to Fredrick Anderson fifty acres on a branch of Cherokee Creek for 40 pounds. Witnesses: Russell Cannon, William Murphy, Ambrose Mayfield.

1790 Census, Greenville District, SC (very near Russel "KENNON" also on p. 93): Perhaps a son of Simcock Cannon/ Kennon, NOT PROVED: William Kennon 1 M 16+ 2 M under 16 4 F any ages

1810 Census, Pendleton Distr. -- the only William is aged 26-45, too young. This William is the son of Russell Cannon.

1810 Census, Greenville District, SC, p. 542/123, Wm Canan, b 1765-1784.

1820 Census, Pendleton Distr. -- 2 Williams, one aged 45+ with many children, who appears to be Russel Cannon's son, the other 45+ with no family at all.

1792: A Wm CANNON signed a petition from Greenville Co., SC. Russel CANNON also signed. (Greenville Co. had been settled less than 10 years at this time). This Wm. could not be Russel's son, who would have been 12-14 years old. #153 in SC Archives, General Assembly Petitions, 1792.

10 Nov 1795: William CANNON was to receive 5 barren cows from Samuel HOLLINGSWORTH, according to a note in Greenville Co., SC. [Too old to be a son of Russell Cannon]

1796: William CANNON and Russel CANNON owed Samuel HOLLINGSWORTH Sr. 18 pounds, 13 shillings, 4 pence if William defaulted. If Russell's William was born 1779, this could be his son, who'd be old enough to transact such debts. If Russell's William were younger, he could not be this William. This is likely to be Russell's brother.

1799: William KANNON of Greenville Co. sold 100 acres (part of tract run by Thomas BRUMMETT and by him conveyed to John CONENHOVEN and from him to John GLASS. Sold to Mary BARNS. Witnesses: David McBRAYER and Aaron SLATEN. Deed Book L, p. 79, 13 May 1799, proved 24 Jul 1813.

1805: William CANNON sold a slave to Jonathan CANNON on 17 Mar 1805. Wit.: James GILLILAND, Jonathan POTS, John TUBB, J.P. Greenville Co., SC.

1806: William CANNON of Greenville Co., SC, bought land on s. side of Gap Creek of middle fork of Saluda River, 100 acres, from Jonathan POTTS. Wit.: Thos. CANTRELL, Nimrod CANTRELL. (03 Aug 1806, Greenville Co., SC.)

1813: William and Jeane (Teaney?) CANNON sold land in Greenville Co., SC, to Jesse MAYFIELD, land on south side of Gap Creek of the middle fork of the Saluda River, 100 acres adjoining Jonathan POTTS and CANNON, part of tract granted to Job COLCOCK surveyed for Ephraim ELLIS, on 14 Feb 1813, Deed Book I, p. 210. Wit.: David McBRAYER, Samuel McJUNKIN. Greenville Co., SC.

Russel's William did not go to MS until between 1830-1840.

The neighbors around Wm Canan in 1810 are very much the same ones found in the 1800 census, but the ages of William Cannon and Wm Canan differ. Either they are two different men, or they are the same man and the census taker made a mistake in his age in 1810.

In 1813 William & Jeaney Cannon sold their Greenville Co. land to Jesse Mayfield, a tract adjoining Jonathan Potts and Cannon. Jon Pots was next door in 1810. Was this William a son of William Cannon in the 1800 census, who was living with his widowed mother?

Not found in 1820 census of Greenville District, SC.

Where did the William of 1810 go?

Name from 1813 land record of Greenville District, SC, in which William and Jeaney or Teaney Cannon sold land. See William Cannon's notes.

CHILD 1 - William Cannon Jr.

From William Cannon census for 1800, Greenville District, SC, who was of an age to be the father of this younger William.

William CANNON sold a slave to Jonathan CANNON on 18 Mar 1805. Wit.: James GILLILAND, Jonathan POTS, John TUBB J.P. (Greenville Co., SC) Jonathan Cannon lived next door to a William Cannon in the 1810 census of Greenville Co. That William appears to have been of an age to be Jonathan's brother. It is known that Jonathan had a brother William who went to White Co., TN, according to documents in McMinn Co., TN, for Jonathan.

If William Cannon of White Co., Tennessee, was the William Cannon in the 1810 census, William married after 1810.

Children's ages are taken from the White Co. census, assuming that all the younger household members were William's children.

CHILD 2 - Jonathan Cannon

Date of death and name of first wife, Sallie Boyd, and her parents, Robert Boyd and Jane Love, are from Betty Shaw, Floridaibis@aol.com, given to Cecilie Gaziano, cgaziano@prodigy.net, in an email on 15 May 2008. According to Jonathan Cannon's son Emberry's application for Indian Land in Texas about 1890, this branch of the family had Chickasaw and Choctaw blood. Betty Shaw compiled a book on her Cannon-Cross Families, copyrighted 1999. Copy of Jonathan's son Emberry's application for land in the Chickasaw Nation gives names of Sallie and her parents; received from Batty K. Fritts in a fax on 25 Jul 2008.

According to Betty Shaw, Jonathan had a brother William. She said that Jonathan sold a female slave with her son to his brother, William, and William, of White Co., TN, was summoned to Court in McMinn Co., TN, to pay Jonathan's debt to Benjamin Harris. Jonathan had sold the slave to his brother to keep Benjamin from taking the slaves in payment for his debt.

1813 William and Jeane Cannon sold land in Greenville Co., SC, to Jesse MAYFIELD, land on south side of Gap Creek of the middle fork of the Saluda River, 100 acres adjoining Jonathan POTTS and CANNON, part of tract granted to Job COLCOCK surveyed for Ephraim ELLIS, on 14 Feb 1813, Deed Book I, page 210. Witnesses: David McBRAYER, Samuel McJUNKIN. [Simcock Cannon and Russell Cannon also had land in this area in 1786.]

1814 12 Jan. Pendleton District (Anderson Co., SC, Deed Book O, pp. 22-23). Jonathan Cannon was among others (William Laffoon, William Finley, John Laffoon, and Andrew Clements) who had made a conditional line that land sold by William Laffoon of Pendleton District touched. Buyer: William Cannon, 200 acres on both sides of Carpenters Creek.

1820 Jonathan Cannon not found in census. Might have been in McMinn Co., TN, for which the 1820 census does not survive. McMinn Co. was formed from Indian lands. According to research by Betty Shaw, Jonathan Cannon was on a jury in McMinn Co. in 1820; therefore, he was a property owner.

1822 Son Irby/Erby Cannon said to have been born in McMinn Co., Tennessee.

1830 Son Thomas Cannon said to have been born in Monroe Co., Tennessee.

CHILD 3 - [Female] Cannon

Deduced from 1790 census for William KENNON of Greenville District, SC, who had 3 females in household who could be daughters. Two are not in the 1800 Greenville District census, so they either died or were married by then. They could have been other relatives or not related.

Could the Mary BARNS below be a daughter of William?

1799 - May 13, William KANNON of Greenville Co., SC, sold 100 acres (part of a tract run by Thomas BRUMMETT and by him conveyed to John CONENHOVEN and from him to John GLASS. Sold to Mary BARNS. Witnesses: David McBRAYER and Aaron SLATEN. Deed Book L, p. 79; proved 24 Jul 1813.

A daughter born in 1774/1784 resided in William's household in 1800 Greenville Co. census.

CHILD 4 - [Female] Cannon

Deduced from 1790 census for William KENNON of Greenville District, SC, who had 3 females in household who could be daughters.

CHILD 5 - [Female] Cannon

Deduced from 1790 census for William KENNON of Greenville District, SC, who had 3 females in household who could be daughters. William Cannon of Greenville District, 1800 census, had a female, assumed to be a daughter, born about 1774/1784.
